

## 02.11.2018 PANEL DISCUSSION Legal Cultures and Civil Procedure

This session will focus on exchanging experiences and establishing networks between legal scholars and legal professionals of Siberia, other areas of Russia and foreign states, and dealing with the problems of modern civil procedure through a cultural perspective.

Since the beginning of the new millennium, many modern jurisdictions have been reviewing the fundamental principles of their judicial procedures. Leading researchers consider cultural and technical changes caused by digitalization and the development of information technologies as the most critical and imperative ways national legal systems develop. In depth research and implementation of cultural and digital factors are used by many countries to reform the law of proof. This is done in order to eliminate legal uncertainty, ensure new security, efficiency and quick and cost-cutting access to justice, as well as to establish a comfortable legal environment for the development of informational technologies and their widespread use in economic and social activities connected with their application.

The Panel Discussion will concentrate on aspects of culture-based legal procedure, including comparative law issues.

## Focus area

- IT-integration into judicial procedure;
- Identification of an individual in e-justice;
- Objectives of procedural proof by evidence;
- Different practices of obtaining case details during a trial;
- Admissibility and reliability as the reasons for evidence gathering;
- Methods of collecting and presenting evidence influenced by changes in the area of public life.
